Types of Scenarios

Traffic Stops

Volunteer drives/rides around in a vehicle and is pulled over by the recruits.

Day 1

(Routine/Misdemeanor)

Examples (speeding, running a stop sign, erratic driving)

Verbal interaction with recruits (conversation)

Day 2

(Suspicious/Felony)

Examples (burglary, robbery, theft)

Physical interaction with recruits (searched, handcuffed)

DWI/DUI (Must be under 60 years old)

Volunteer assists/monitors drinkers walking to and from the restroom/gym
Volunteer may be asked to role-play being under the influence of alcohol

Domestic/Family Violence

Volunteer role-plays in various domestic violence situations
Examples (abuser, victim, concerned family member/friend, coworker)
Verbal and physical interaction with recruits

Six Flags

Volunteer role-plays in a bar situation (Crazy Horse Saloon)
Examples (bartender, bar patron, witness)
Verbal interaction with recruit

Volunteer may also be pulled to role-play in other scenarios throughout the park.

Examples (burglar, victim, shop owner, restaurant worker, witness)

Verbal and physical interaction with recruits (searched, handcuffed)

The scenarios are a method of training the recruits so they have an idea of what to expect when they are in the field.

This is a very rewarding experience.
