CALL TO ORDER: LT. JAMES LONG

TIME: 7:00 PM

Pledge of allegiance to the flag of USA was performed. Fifty-two members were in attendance. A moment of silence was observed for fallen police officers and our military.

Chuck Haines introduced Officer Timothy Hayden who spoke on the Use of Force Continuum. Tim presented the levels of control and levels of resistance using a slide presentation. This was followed by several scenarios demonstrating how to make the right decisions in a moment's notice. His presentation was engaging and informative. As he had experienced being tased during his training, he was especially able to explain and show how it felt first hand.

Bill Jezek started the general meeting at 7:45 PM.

He reviewed that the position of Director of Fundraisers was open if anyone was interested.

Shirts are available to those who placed an order.

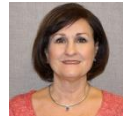

Operation Identification

Operation Identification is a citizen's burglary prevention program for use in home and businesses. This involves marking of property with an identifying number as means of discouraging burglary and theft. This has shown dramatic results in communities to reduce burglaries.

The **Operation ID** is composed of two parts:

First, mark your valuables with your **Driver's License Number** so that property can be easily traced and identified as yours.

Second, display a sticker which tells would be burglars that your property has been marked.

FLAG ETIQUETTE

Just a reminder on flag etiquette with all the events taking place over the last few days.



To place the flag at half-staff, hoist it to the peak for an instant and lower it to a position half way between the top and bottom of the staff. The flag is to be raised again to the peak for a moment before it is lowered. On Memorial Day the flag is displayed at half-staff until noon and at full staff from noon to sunset.

The flag is to be flown at half-staff in mourning for designated, principal government leaders and upon presidential or gubernatorial order.
