APD EMPLOYEES OF THE MONTH



Field Operations – Corporal Quan Nguyen comes to work each day with a positive attitude and an eagerness to work. He recently completed the Firearms Instructor course and has made himself available to assist officers with qualifications and extra practice outside of his normal work shift. He is a Mental Health Subject Matter Expert and co-instructor for Crisis Intervention Training with the recruits. He actively seeks opportunities to assist and educate the citizens as well as his peers. He was selected as one of the department’s new PTO’s and has wholeheartedly embraced his new position. Quan led the shift in handling dispatched calls for service at twice the shift average, as well as self initiated Calls and traffic stops, both of which were nearly three times the shift average. He has quickly shown that he is a top producer and a leader on the shift.



Support Operations –Officer Jennifer Archer is currently assigned as a background investigator/recruiter in the Personnel/Recruiting Unit. She is always quick to volunteer for any assignment and is always looking for innovative and new ideas to improve the unit. During this time period, she was tasked with finalizing Class 54. The original goal for this class was 15 recruits and in January this number increased to 20. The final weeks leading up to an academy start date is always hectic, especially when the projected numbers increase. When an applicant failed the final board, this put the unit at risk for not meeting the departments goal to hire 20 officers for this academy. Jennifer quickly assessed the applicant pool and identified an applicant that was being worked for the July academy. This applicant was agreeable to start early and after a feverishly aggressive background investigation, he successfully passed the final board and the units goal was met.



Management Services – Maribel Padron is the Office Assistant in Internal Affairs. She demonstrates skills in office management, customer service and unit efficiency. She has improved the office organizational layout and is working on a manual to detail the processes within IAD. She is often the first line of information for citizens and those in other city departments and communicates in an effective manner. She has gained trust with those who seek information and is reliable and self sufficient and can be counted on to provide requested information in a timely manner. Maribel has a talent for defusing Crisis situations and often speaks with citizens who are dissatisfied and angry. She obtains the needed information, remains professional and has compassion for assisting external as well as internal customers with their issue.

April 12, 2018

Treasurer Paul Goodman gave the Treasurer's report. He stated that the Association's bank account will be moved to Chase Bank soon. The Audit Committee has started the audit.

Director Linda Holland reviewed the volunteer requirements for the May events:
